**THE BALLOT INITIATIVES (PROPOSITIONS):**The Northside Democrats recommend the following actions.

*NOTE* that propositions passed by the voters can only be changed by a statewide vote or a supermajority of the legislature. The wording of propositions may be obscure or deceptive. **If you don't understand the wording or don't agree with ALL parts of a proposition, consider voting NO** and working for change within the legislature.

<b>PROPOSITION:</b>	<b>VOTE:</b>
<b>125</b> "PUBLIC RETIREMENT SYSTEMS" - bipartisan amendment to stabilize and improve the AZ pension system for corrections officers and elected officials, resulting in tax savings; <b>unanimously approved by all State legislators.</b>	<b>YES</b>
<b>126</b> "PROHIBITION OF TAXATION OF SERVICES". An <b>unnecessary, misleading, special-interest</b> amendment that would prevent cities and the state from dealing effectively with economic changes. <b>Arizona does not tax services.</b>	<b>NO</b>
<b>127</b> "RENEWABLE ENERGY PRODUCTION" - requires AZ electricity providers to produce 50% of electricity from renewable sources by 2030. Investment in solar and wind technology is expected to create jobs, reduce pollution, improve health, and reduce energy costs by \$4 billion. <i>For more information: <a href="http://cleanhealthyaz.com">cleanhealthyaz.com</a></i>	<b>YES</b>
<b>305</b> "EXPANSION OF EDUCATION EMPOWERMENT SCHOLARSHIP ACCOUNTS " - An attempt to increase SCHOOL VOUCHERS, which <b>privatize education by taking tax revenues away from the public school system</b> and funding private, religious, and home-based schooling. <i>For more information: <a href="http://teamsosarizona.com/get-the-facts">teamsosarizona.com/get-the-facts</a></i>	<b>NO</b>
<b>306</b> "CLEAN ELECTIONS " - an amendment to <b>undercut the independence of the Clean Elections Commission</b> , and to prevent publicly funded candidates from using their own party's resources. <i>See: <a href="http://azadvocacy.org/noprop306">azadvocacy.org/noprop306</a></i>	<b>NO</b>
