Tuesday, November 3, 2020, is GENERAL ELECTION DAY. THE BALLOT INITIATIVES (PROPOSITIONS):

NOTE that statewide propositions, if passed, can only be changed by a statewide vote or a supermajority of the legislature. The wording of propositions may be obscure or deceptive. **If you don't understand** the wording or **don't agree with ALL parts** of a proposition, **consider voting NO** and working for change within the legislature.

PROPOSITION:

207: "SMART AND SAFE ARIZONA"- would establish a **state-regulated and taxed system** for licensed businesses to produce and sell small amounts of marijuana for private use by persons over 21. Sponsored by medical-marijuana dispensaries; removes marijuana use from the influence of the criminal underworld. *For more information:* wikipedia.org/wiki/2020_Arizona_Proposition_207

208: "INVEST IN EDUCATION" - would **restore funding of Arizona K-12 public education** [cut by \$4 billion since 2009] by a 3.5% surtax on large *taxable* (not gross) incomes (over \$500,000 per couple). Only 1% of all Arizonans would pay the tax. US. Census Bureau currently ranks AZ as 47th lowest state in per-pupil spending. *For more information:* investined.com/get-the-facts
