If you don't understand the wording or don't agree with ALL parts of a proposition, consider voting NO and working for change within the legislature.

PROPOSITION:	VOTE:
125 "PUBLIC RETIREMENT SYSTEMS" - bipartisan constitutional amendment to adjust the formula for Arizona pension benefits for corrections officers and elected officials.	NO
126 "PROHIBITION OF TAXATION OF SERVICES". An unnecessary, misleading, special-interest amendment that would prevent cities and the state from dealing effectively with economic changes. Arizona does not tax services.	NO
127 "RENEWABLE ENERGY PRODUCTION" - requires AZ electricity providers to produce 50% of electricity from renewable sources by 2030. Investment in solar and wind technology is expected to create jobs, reduce pollution, improve health, and reduce energy costs by \$4 billion. For more information: cleanhealthyaz.com	YES
305 "EXPANSION OF EDUCATION EMPOWERMENT SCHOLARSHIP ACCOUNTS" - An attempt to increase SCHOOL VOUCHERS, which privatize education by taking tax revenues away from the public school system and funding private, religious, and home-based schooling.
